

SMCS Board of Trustees President's Report October 18, 2017

Professional Development

- Erin Loritz, a consultant from CESA 6, spent three days in our system in October working with our K- 5 teachers in each building as they implement a new literacy program based on the work of Lucy Calkins. Feedback from the teachers and the principals has been very positive as Erin models lessons at different grade levels and then discusses them with the teachers after.
- P3 12 teachers spent the morning of September 22nd participating in a workshop through ArtsCore as they were introduced to arts integration techniques.
- Three Early Childhood teachers participated in a full day conference "Learning without Tears" on October 6th in Madison. Five EC teachers have now completed this training.
- On October 24th all K-12 teachers and administrators will be attending a day long Education Convocation at the
 KI Center in Green Bay. This Convocation, sponsored by the Green Bay Diocese, will host a keynote address by
 nationally known author and educator, Cathy Vatterott. Her address will focus on her book, <u>Rethinking Grading</u>.
 Breakout sessions on various educational topics will follow.

Curriculum

 Project Lead the Way (PLTW) is into its second year of implementation at the elementary schools and middle school, expanding to grades 2-8. Discussions have begun regarding its move into the high school curriculum to start during the 2018-19 school year.

Fine Arts

- The Marching Band, under the direction of Pamela Barnhill, performed their first field routine at the halftime show during the Homecoming Football game.
- The Zephyr fine arts booster club (ZFAB) produced the second annual Family Feud game show/fundraiser on October 14th.
- The high school fine arts department has kicked off a SCRIP fundraiser to assist with expenses that will be incurred when students travel to New York City in spring 2018.

HR/Safety/Wellness

Wellness: The October 9th onsite flu-shot clinic was taken advantage of by 25 employees.

Fitness Center: The Fitness Center has been experiencing increased use. All of our high and middle school students have received their orientation to the equipment. A waiver agreement has been created for student usage. Supervised hours have been established for September/October, with the goal to increase open hours during the winter months. A cleaning service has also been contracted.

A SMCHS student strength and conditioning program has been developed. All students will be encouraged by teachers and coaches to work out with a program and a plan in mind. Athletic and middle school programming will begin roll-out next week as the fall season is ending.

Admissions/Recruitment & Retention

- The "SMCS Campus Showcase", held on Sunday, October 1st just prior to the student homecoming activities, was designed for SMCS families and alumni. The event featured campus tours, blessing/dedication of the Fitness Center, and each family received a gift of a Zephyr sport tote bag.

Fund Development & Alumni Relations

Annual Fund: First brochure and commitment cards were mailed late September. Status as of today = \$27,143 toward the \$200,000 goal.
