### NEW FINE ARTS EDUCATION CENTER

On April 13, 2013, the new Jane Bergstrom Fine Arts Education Center was dedicated and blessed by the Most Reverend David L. Ricken, Bishop of the Diocese of Green Bay, in a beautiful ceremony that included TCCES students, local parish priests, project and community leaders and local dignitaries. Attendees were, for the first time, able to see the addition to St. Mary Central High School that includes a fully-equipped, state-of-the-art theater and a forensic forum, as well as four interactive classrooms, each with a specific science, technology or career

development purpose. Later in the day, The Duttons, an intergenerational variety act from Branson, Missouri, entertained guests in two well-attended performances to celebrate the grand opening. Then, Tuesday, April 16, the St. Mary Central community celebrated its first all-school liturgy in the new facility.

In addition to the 495-seat theater, the new Jane Bergstrom Fine Arts Education Center includes a fly-rigging system, set production shop, green room and forensic theater. The venue will now provide a marvelous facility for students to develop and share their gifts in theater, vocal, instrumental and visual arts, as well as their behind-the-scenes production talents.

Each of the four new technology classrooms is unique and will be available to classes, school clubs and community members and groups for educational purposes. The four rooms include a distance learning lab, a forensic/presentation lab, a business marketing and graphics design lab and an I-STEM (Innovation-Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) classroom. These facilities will enable students to develop 21st-century skills, interact with instructors and peers from around the world and receive specialized training in technology-based career skills.

Even as St. Mary Central has adapted to a changing world, it has consistently maintained a sound foundation in faith, academics and service. In recent years, the addition of the one-to-one laptop program, the Mandarin Chinese language and culture curriculum and more accelerated, AP and CAPP courses has furthered the school's quest for academic excellence. No one knows better than St. Mary/St. Mary Central alumni that the school has always been firmly dedicated to educating the whole student.

Many alumni embraced the fine arts education center project, and were actively involved in the planning and fundraising, working to give today's and tomorrow's students greater opportunities. Alumna Barb (Braun '93) Unruh's four children all attend TCCES schools. Her two oldest are students at St. Mary Central, where they are actively involved in fine arts and interested in the sciences. While attending the grand opening, Unruh recalled with amusement the days of putting on stage makeup in the basement cafeteria at the old school and performing to an audience seated in folding chairs. "I am amazed at how far SMC has come since my high school days," she reflected. "What a legacy we are leaving for the students of today and way into the future. It sure is an exciting time to be a Zephyr!"





# ALUMNUS REFLECTS ON SERVING MASS WITH POPE BENEDICT XVI

Matt Rappl, a seminarian currently studying in Rome and a 2009 SMC graduate, recently reflected on being chosen to serve Christmas Eve Mass with Pope Benedict XVI at St. Peter's Basilica. Below are excerpts from that reflection.

"In the awe of standing under Bernini's massive baldachinno above the altar, and staring down the expanse that is St. Peter's central nave, it's not too hard to get carried away in the moment... Thankfully, everything in St. Peter's points to the altar.

The privilege of serving the Christmas Vigil Mass was something that will remain with me for a lifetime... One can't help but be moved by the sheer immensity of St. Peter's Basilica and the architects certainly had that in mind when they were constructing it... Another thing that struck me about the Mass was observing the cardinals ascending the steps to the altar to receive Holy Communion. These men have given their lives in service to the Church. Some of them have even experienced persecution in their own countries and yet they were all united in their love of the Holy Father and were present to celebrate one of the greatest of all mysteries, the Incarnation. What a joy it is, indeed, to celebrate the birth of Christ in the heart of the church, above the tomb of St. Peter, with our current pope, Benedict XVI." Used with permission from The Compass

### SMC GRADS "GROW LOCAL"

In 2011, St. Mary Central grads Calvin Andersen '07 and Steve Catlin '07 teamed up with a college roommate to form Grow Local, a start-up farming operation offering sustainable produce grown using organic methods. A greenhouse-enclosed system called aquaponics (raising fish in tanks and growing plants in the water), is one example of how Grow Local plans to create a sustainable food source that will invigorate the community, economically and environmentally. "The Fox Valley is a great market for local food, and

right now we're finding, to our pleasure, that those looking for local products are underserved here," Catlin said.

The trio has overcome some growing pains because figuring out how to run a business as well as a farm is no easy feat. Luckily they aren't afraid to get their hands dirty! But sustainable agriculture is not the only goal at Grow Local. Developing a sustainable business is also high priority. The current operation on Park Avenue in Neenah is a pilot project to prove the model, and is the first step in a larger plan to franchise Grow Local. "We kind of had the notion when we started that we wanted to save the world," said partner Alex Fehrenbach. "Our vision for the future is still the same. We want to be an integral part of the community for education and food and for entrepreneurship." For more information, visit the website at growlocal.us.
