


S.G. Third Grade November 2017 Newsletter

The third graders were very excited about our duck and pheasant adaptations comparison lab.




We learned that some ducks nest in trees. In this photo, Ruby and Grace are examining a wood duck.

Tarver gave an outstanding Getting to Know You presentation.




Tarver's presentation included a fun video that he made to demonstrate his skills.




