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Eighteen SMCHS Students Earn AP Scholar Awards

Fox Cities: Eighteen students at St. Mary Catholic High School have earned AP Scholar Awards in recognition of their exceptional achievement on AP exams. This honor was bestowed on 22% of the Class of 2017.

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program® (AP®) provides willing and academically prepared students with the opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses while still in high school, and to earn college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP exams. About 22 percent of the 2.2 million student worldwide who took AP exams performed at a sufficiently high level to also earn a AP Scholar Award.

The College Board recognizes several levels of achievement based on students' performance on AP exams.

At St. Mary Catholic High School:

- **Peyton Jack**, all 2017 graduate, qualified for the *National AP Scholar Award* by earning an average score of 4 or higher in all AP exams taken, and scores of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams.
- Seven students, **Nathan Berg, Patrick Golichnik, Colin Higgins, Peyton Jack, Joseph Kerwin** and **William O'Brien** (from the Class of 2017) and **Eric Meier** (a senior this year), all qualified for the *AP Scholar with Distinction Award* by earning an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.
- Five Class of 2017 members—**Katherine Britt, Michael Cops, Caileen Fahrenkrug, Cecilia Krautkramer** and **Aaron Schwister** qualified for the *AP*

Scholar with Honor Award by earning an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more.

- Six students, 2017 graduates **Regan Andersen, Margaret Braatz, Ryan Murray, Alexander Rosiejka** and **Garrett Tully** and current senior **Mollie Olson** qualified for the *AP Scholar Award* by completing three or more AP exams with scores of 3 or higher.

Of this year's award recipients at SMCHS, the seniors have the 2017-18 school year to complete college-level work and possibly earn a higher-level AP Scholar Award.

AP provides willing and academically prepared students with the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced placement and stand out in the college admission process. More than 3600 colleges and universities annually receive AP scores, and most four-year colleges in the U.S. provide credit and/or advanced placement for qualifying exam scores.
