# **Admissions**

- SMCS was gifted with a sponsorship for Lifest 2018. We will have a table/booth at the event marketplace, as well as an ad and our logo in the event promotional pieces.
- With collaboration from elementary principals, creating a focus group (parents, teachers, non-SMCS parents, etc.) to discuss recruitment and retention for our early childhood program

**Enrollment** for **2018-19** is currently at **843 vs 817** reported last month, with Preschool and Pre-K still expected to rise and STS students not yet registered for high school. A high level of activity is taking place with recruiting efforts, tours, and SMCS promotional activities.

## Annual Fund:

- YTD = \$183,217...with two weeks and many 'asks' still out there. Often times there is a flurry of activity at the end of the campaign to meet the fiscal year deadline. Projecting to reach over \$185,000.
- 2018/19 AF: the printed brochure and letter for March 2019 mailing is almost complete. Timeline: SMCS employee pledge cards will be distributed at August in-service and then mailed to community mid-September.

Arts and craft activities and games for families in attendance, along with small prizes and SMCS information are provided. SMCS will have a monthly presence at both markets throughout the summer.
- Saturday, June 23, is the annual Blue Inn Dance at Smith Park. This is for alumni from Menasha HS and SMC that have recreated the infamous summer dance that was a weekly occurrence during the 50s and 60s. They offer great raffle prizes and split the proceeds with both schools. SMCS staff are on-hand to gather updated alumni information, assist with the raffles and thank them for their support of SMC yet today.
