<u>Report Cards</u>

First quarter report cards will be coming home on Friday. However, you do not need to wait until Friday to see your child's grades. You can always log onto PowerSchool to see your child's grades. Please call the school office if you need help with getting your parent account set up. Our goal this year is to have 100% of our parents logged in and monitoring their child's progress. PowerSchool is a great tool and resource for you.

For eighth grade students taking high school credit classes, there will be two reports coming home, middle school report card and a high school report card. The middle school report card has a GPA on it which does figure in your high school credit class. Your high school report card will not show a GPA until semester time.

<u>Students After School</u>

We are having a problem with students staying after school waiting for their next activity to begin. We do not offer after school supervision, (in fact, there are times when we have staff meetings or after school events and no staff are in the building.) So we ask that all students are picked up at 3:12 and come back to school for their evening activity. If you need your child to stay, please have them go over to the fitness center, where there is supervision, until their evening event begins.
