Professional Development

Plans are underway for an ALPHA Retreat for all SMCS staff on January 21st. The day will include videos, small group discussions, opportunities for personal reflection, music and sharing at lunch. The day will culminate with a Mass and staff blessing.

As we continue to implement Units of Study in reading and writing at the elementary school and reading at the middle school, Erin Loritz will be on site at various points in January to demonstrate lessons directly in classrooms and hold teacher discussions after.

Curriculum

Plans are underway for student testing as we roll out registration for year two of the Aquinas Program. Mid-year elementary and middle school MAPS testing will be held for students new to our system and for students for whom teachers would require additional progress information. This complements the fall and spring testing that is done with all K-8 students.

Fine Arts

- Zephyrs Fine Arts Boosters (ZFAB) has narrowed down four student winners for their first art competition. The theme was "Fabulous Fruit" and winning submissions will be used to promote the Fine Arts Fruit Sale, which runs January 28 to February 8. A Faith based art competition is scheduled to be announced around the time of Catholic Schools Week.
- ZFAB is getting ready for the second annual Z CABARET. This unique, on-stage event creates an intimate setting for our community to celebrate fine arts while raising money for our fine arts programs. Two shows on February 8 & 9 come complete with live entertainment, hors d'oeuvres, and cash bar. 6:00 Social, 7:00 Show.

- 14 high school music students played and sang in the 2019 Big East Choir and Band Concert on January 3 at the Capitol Civic Centre in Manitowoc.
- Middle School auditions and callbacks took place the week of January 7 for the April musical: James and the Giant Peach Jr.

Admissions

- Launched **2019-20 registration** December 20 using current registration system since PowerSchool Registration was not ready; this was a wise decision since we are still in testing mode with Diocese
- **Transition Grade Discount** and early registration incentive offered December 20, 2018-January 31, 2019
 - o Approximate 5% savings in tuition for grades K, 6, and 9
 - \$160 in savings for K
 - \$210 in savings for grade 6
 - \$320 in savings for grade 9
 - 50% discount for early registration
 - \$50 registration fee (max of \$150 per family)
 - \$100 registration fee (\$300 per family) AFTER January 31, 2019

Communications/Website

We are working with Stellar Blue to improve our SEO, key words for Google, creating a Secure Socketlayer Certificate (Encrypted connection between the user and the server, required for processing payments/donations on the site or other sensitive data transmitted through the website as well as google recognition) and a digital marketing plan. Some updates will be seen in February.

Business Services: Finance/Technology/Food Service

- Working on open registration procedures and updating the Tuition Information Sheet with several new grants
- Prepared staff roster for ACA 1095 reporting; Schenck/CLA provides the expertise.
- Staff Training St. Mary elementary new principal and new admin assistant "just in time" training provided
- Attended Diocese meeting regarding School Choice audits with SMCS President. Currently the
 Diocese receives \$12,000,000 from WPCP with only 9 of 57 schools in the Diocese not
 participating yet. Audit fees total between \$350,000 and \$400,000. Plans for an RFP to get
 one audit firm and reduce audit fees. This would be done by the Diocese taking the lead on
 many of the requirements that can be centralized, utilizing Power School's report features and
 providing guidelines for standard responses across all entities. SMCS would expect a cost
 reduction as well as saving staff time if this becomes a reality.
- Attended seminar on FASB's Accounting Standards Update. 2019-20 financial statements need to be restructured to meet new FASB's standards and changes to revenue recognition.
- **Finance Committee** working on 2019-20 budget. Worked with Pat Hickey on technology plan and budget.
- **Food Service** billings stalled due to delay of opening the Power School registration program. Working with high school Patti and Peter to distribute hard copy of bills prior to finals. Other principals will distribute with report cards. Standard letter at all schools; will include balance and instructions for updating Power School.

Fund Development/Events

Annual Fund

- As of 1.9.19 total is \$109,782 toward our \$200,00 goal (last year to date we were at \$128,532-so trailing about \$18,750). However, 440 donations thus far, compared to 399 donations to date last year (average of \$322/donor last year vs. \$250/donor to date).
- An excess of \$30,000 was received during the holiday/ year end period
- Plan to get on track and ahead: Follow-up calls to past donors that have not yet donated start January 14th throught February 15th (Sarah Graper and Dustin McClone. A second ask will be mailed *March* 1st with another follow-up call plan thereafter.

SMCS Foundation - Communication plan in final stages of development. The Board's goal is to secure five donations and/or estate plan designations by December 31, 2019.
