

SMCS Board of Trustees President's Report for May 15, 2019

Professional Development

- ALPHA sessions for all employees concluded for this year on May 10th. Pat Batey is working with the Diocese on approval of a faith component to our Professional Development for the 2019 – 2020 school year. The ALPHA series received very favorable feedback from staff.
- As SMCS develops the theme of "Delivery of Instruction" for next year, a pilot plan for Differentiated Instruction for Professional Development will be implemented. In this plan, two days will be determined as exchange days for teachers and counselors who wish to take advantage of professional learning opportunities on their own time over the summer, on weekends, or after school. With pre-approval and proof of attendance, they will then be able to exchange up to sixteen hours on those two pre-determined days. Those who do not wish to take advantage of this opportunity will attend professional learning sessions planned by the principals on-site.

Curriculum

- A focus on literacy at both the elementary and middle school levels will continue into next year with support from CESA 6.
- English (9-12) and Social Studies (K-12) will begin a review process this summer and will continue through next school year.

Fine Arts

- Try-outs for the summer Community Theater production of *Mary Poppins* were held. Performances will take place July 18-21.
- Our band and choir programs have completed the year with a series of vocal and instrumental concerts. Many awards from the State Music Association were earned by our choir and instrumental students including multiple firsts and golds.

Fund Development/Events

Zephyrfest 2019: Thank you to all 645 attendees, 97 volunteers, our sponsors and guests for making Zephyrfest a spectacular night to remember! Because of your support, we can continue our work to inspire students in leading faith-filled lives and finding success through learning. Net profit: \$348,000+ projected; budget is \$330,000. Plans are being discussed for next year's event.

Annual Fund: As of 5.10.19, total is \$157,281 of our \$200,000 goal:

- Last year at this time we were at \$172,766 so trailing \$15,485 year to date
- 663 donations thus far, compared to 595 donations to date last year
- Average donation amount this year is \$233 versus \$290 last year
- Calls continue to be made to those who have donated in past years and have not yet done so

St. Mary Catholic Schools Foundation

- The new Gift Acceptance Policy and Donor Agreement will be approved at the May 20th meeting.
- The Educational Trust Committee has met with the SMCS Foundation Committee and are deciding on the best options for the Education Trust oversight management.
- Prospect letter is to be finalized soon and meetings have already been taking place with
 prospective donors. The rollout timeline has changed a bit since January. The goal is to have a
 total of five donations and/or estate plan designations by the end of December 2019.

Grants

- One additional grant was submitted through International Paper for \$10,000 towards Literacy.
- Currently writing for \$40,000 in matching grants through Bergstrom/Toyota/Lexus.
