NEW Engineering Technology Open House

The UW - Oshkosh Engineering Technology Department invites you to their first annual Open House on Friday, October 11th from 10am-2pm (third floor - Halsey Science Center). Lunch is provided and students will meet faculty and staff, interact with current students, and explore both the department and campus. The Engineering Technology Department offers three majors: Electrical, Environmental, and Mechanical Engineering Technology; each of which leads to the Bachelors of Science degree. All three majors have been accredited by the Engineering Technology Accreditation Commission of ABET. UW-Oshkosh is now the only school in Wisconsin to have a full suite of Engineering Technology programs that are accredited.

NEW StEP-UP

The Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW) is offering the Student Enrichment Program for Underrepresented Professions (StEP-UP) to help support students who have an interest in pursuing careers in science and medicine. StEP-UP is a competitive program designed to provide opportunities to students from



disadvantaged backgrounds, underrepresented cultural and ethnic groups, and individuals with disabilities. NEW Senior Transcripts & Applications

- Transcript requests are made by the student in Naviance for electronic delivery to colleges and universities.

AP Changes

Beginning this year, AP exam registration for yearlong courses will take place in the fall. Test order forms will be distributed by AP teachers during classes in October.

Testing fees will remain at \$94 per test, however there are two new fees instituted by Collegeboard to encourage student commitment:

- On-time order = \$94 per exam
- Late order = \$94 + \$40 late fee
- Unused/cancelled order = \$40
- AP exams which begin in the fall MUST BE ORDERED IN THE FALL to avoid the late fee.
- Tests for AP classes which begin in the Spring will be ordered in the Spring.

Global Education Achievement Certificate (GEAC)

The GEAC is offered to SMCHS students who have demonstrated a strong interest in global citizenship by successfully completing a global education curriculum and engaging in co-curricular activities and experiences that foster the development of global competencies. To earn this certificate, students must submit a portfolio with evidence of:

- 4 HS credits of one world language
- 4 credits of coursework with a global focus (from approved list or approved by GEAC committee)
- 4 co-curricular activities or cultural events with a global focus
- 8 Cultural Literacy reflections (eight works of international /cultural media, including at least 4 books)
- Global service learning project (minimum of 20 hours)

<u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</u> applications open Oct 1st. The FAFSA determines eligibility for grants, work-study, and student loans so be sure to apply early. Contact the Financial Aid Office of schools you have applied to with any questions.
